# WHAT TO RECYCLE?

---

## PAPER

### *Newspaper:*

Stack newspapers in brown paper bags (please, no plastic bags which can't be recycled) or tie in bundles with string. Newspaper inserts are accepted.

Magazines may or may not be inserted. Ask locally. Pass magazines onto others to be reused, otherwise bundle separately in weights less than 50 lbs.

### *White Ledger:*

Copier, typing, computer, note and stationary paper and envelopes that are free of plastic (no window envelopes). Place in a paper bag or deposit in box provided at the local drop off.

### *Colored Paper & Magazines:*

All colored paper is acceptable. Ask locally about magazines. Place in paper bag or in a box at local drop off.

### *Corrugated Cardboard and Paperboard:*

Paperboard is gray or white non-corrugated cardboard, such as cereal and shoe boxes. Remove any plastic bag liners or cellophane windows. Cardboard and paperboard with wax or plastic coating such as milk cartons and ice cream containers are not accepted. Cardboard should be flattened and tied in bundles or stacked in a brown paper bag.

## GLASS

Jars and bottles should be rinsed and caps removed. Colorless glass, green glass and brown glass should be separated and placed in the designated containers. No ceramics, plate glass, headlights, dishes, light bulbs or Pyrex.

## PLASTIC

We use many plastic containers in our households that can be recycled. Plastic, like what is found in milk, orange juice and laundry detergent bottles, is made from the resin HDPE (high density polyethylene) and does not crack when flattened. These containers should be rinsed out and the caps removed. PET or PETE (polyethylene terephthalate) such as water and clear soft drink bottles are recyclable, too. All caps should be removed and thrown in the regular trash.

## COMPOSTING

Composting, the simplest of the recycling processes, can reduce our landfilled waste by 30%. Leaves, grass clippings, hay, garden remnants and kitchen scraps (no bones or meat) is a good recipe for compost. You can make compost in a bin (3' high by 3' wide works best) or you can build a pile on the ground at the edge of your garden. Layer the ingredients and sprinkle each with water and pack them down. Turn the mixture every three days to aerate and sprinkle it with water to keep it moist.



## CANS

Aluminum beverage cans and bimetal/steel cans (such as soup cans) are 100% recyclable and should be separated and placed curbside or taken to a local drop-off center. It's not necessary to crush them.

## OTHER MATERIALS

Depending upon the town in which you live, there are other recyclable materials that may be collected at curbside or accepted at town drop-off centers. These materials may include:

wood/brush	white goods (appliances)
grass clippings	scrap metal
tires	motor oil
electronic/computer equipment/tv's	car batteries
used cooking oil	fluorescent bulbs
concrete/brick/block	

## WHAT NOT TO RECYCLE

Do not put the following items in your recycling bin!

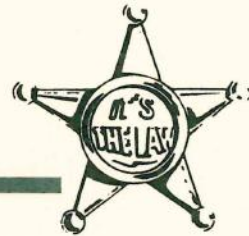
Plastic bags  
Chemicals  
Syringes or medical waste  
Food or garbage  
Ceramics, broken glass, Pyrex or mirrors  
Garden waste  
Styrofoam, Polystyrene or plastic wrap

# WHERE TO RECYCLE?

**ALLOWAY:** Convenience Center located on Thomas Road. Glass, plastic, newspaper, magazines, cardboard, aluminum and steel cans, metal and aluminum scraps, used oil, white goods, tires, auto batteries and brush. Clean paper (junk mail, office paper envelopes), electronics (TV's, computer components, household appliances). Must be an Alloway Township resident and obtain a Convenience Center Permit Sticker. Closed Holidays. Not Accepted Items: Construction, Demolition, Anti-Freezer, Concrete, Propane Bottles, Grass Clippings. Public Works Department will pick up and chip brush bi-annually. Call 935-5271 to make arrangements. Fees required for white goods, tires, wood/brush and evergreen trees. For complete trash and recycling information, visit the Township's website or download the "Recycle Coach" app.

**ELMER:** Curbside commingled pickup only. Commingled glass, plastic, aluminum and steel cans, newspaper, magazines, junk mail, paper and cardboard. Trash every Wednesday. Recycling every other Thursday. White goods last Friday of the month. Electronics must be taken to the SCIA Convenience Center in Alloway for recycling.

**LOWER ALLOWAYS CREEK, MANNINGTON, ELSINBORO:** Curbside pickup per schedule for glass, plastic, newspaper, magazines, paper, cardboard, aluminum and steel cans. LAC residents must bring the following to the LAC municipal garage for recycling during Recycling Center hours only: used motor oil, car batteries, tires, consumer electronic, white goods, and iron. Leaves will be picked up in November and December.
